MORE RESTRICTIVE METHODS OF TREATING RESOURCES THAN THOSE OF THE SSI PROGRAM - Section 1902 (f) States only.

1902 (f)

1.) Resource limitation is \$1,500 for an individual and \$2,250 for a couple.

2.) The home is no longer considered to be the principal place of residence and is a countable resource if the individual resides in a nursing facility, intermediate care facility for the mentally retarded (ICF-MR), or other medical institution for a continuous period of thirteen months or longer; however, the home is not a countable resource if any of the following individuals are residing in the home:

- a) The individual's spouse; or
- b) The individual's child who is under age twenty-one; or
- c) The individual's blind or disabled child; or
- d) The individual's child who is age sixty-five or older and is financially dependent upon the individual for housing; or
- e) The individual's sibling who has a verified equity and ownership interest in the home and has resided in the home for at least one year immediately before the date the individual was admitted to the nursing facility.
