Breast & Cervical Cancer Project

The Breast and Cervical Cancer Project provides cancer screenings and medical coverage to eligible women in Ohio.

Together, the Ohio Medicaid and the Ohio Department of Health provide services and health care coverage to eligible women in need of treatment for breast and/or cervical cancer, including pre-cancerous conditions.

Who is eligible for screenings?

Women who are eligible are uninsured and meet certain financial guidelines and are in need of pre-cancerous screenings. Women between the ages of 40 and 65 are eligible for pap tests and clinical breast exams. Women age 40 to 50 are eligible if they have a family history of breast cancer. Women who are age 50 to 65 and are already enrolled in the program are eligible for mammograms.

What services are available?

In addition to breast and cervical cancer screenings, other diagnostic services are available, including mammograms, pap tests, office visits, and biopsies. Case management services are also available.

Who provides services?

The project is made up of eleven regional, multi-county projects that provide screening and clinical services through a network of about 600 providers statewide.

After a screening and if a woman is diagnosed with breast and/or cervical cancer, or a pre-cancerous condition, Ohio Medicaid will provide coverage for her treatment and health care if she is eligible.
